1. Will I get a report card?

Yes, you will report progress at each quarter giving an overall average and a snapshot of your progress in Summit. You will also receive a report card at the end of the year when grades are final. 2. What do the Summit colors on my dashboard represent?


- a. Red: You have not turned the assignment in and it is late
- b. Yellow: You have turned the assignment in, but have feedback and need to revise
- c. Green: You have turned the assignment in and met the criteria on the rubric

3. How is my grade calculated?

Here's a quick visual reference of how grades are determined:

English, Soc. Studies, & Science Courses Two areas determine a student's grade:

Cognitive Skills scores (from Final Products in Projects) and Focus Area progress.




Non-Math Course Breakdown:

- a. 80% Cognitive Skills scores
- b. 14% Power Focus Area progress
- c. 6% Additional Focus Area progress.

Mathematics Courses

Three areas determine a student's grade: End-Of-Unit Assessments scores, Focus Area progress, and Portfolio Problem scores.



Math Course Breakdown

- 70% Unit Assessment scores
- 20% Focus Area progress
- 10% Portfolio Problem score



4. What are the grade level cognitive skill scores?
